REMEMBERING SOME OF THE GREAT FEMALE MILITARY - FIRST RANKINGS



Mildred Catherine Kelly

(Jan. 24, 1928 - Jan. 27, 2003) served in the United States Army from March 1947 to April 1976. In 1972, she became the first black command sergeant major in the United States Army. Two years later in 1974, she made the rank

of the first black female command sergeant major at Aberdeen Proving Ground. She became the first African American woman to hold the rank of sergeant major and command sergeant major in the US Army and became the first female command sergeant major of a predominantly male Army installation.



Major General Marcelite J. Harris (Jan. 16, 1943 - Sep. 07, 2018) served in the United States Air Force after completing a training program in December 1965 as Second Lieutenant and continued to rise in rank. 1975 her eleven-year career in the U.S. Air Force took a turn.

Which led her to being named a White House aide during the Presidential administrations of Gerald Ford and Jimmy Carter. Harris continued to rise in rank and on May 25, 1995, Harris was promoted to two-star Major General. She was the first woman to hold the position of Major General in the U.S. Air Force. Major General Marcelite Harris retired from military service February 23, 1997. Between 1975 and her retirement Harris has a lot of female first military rankings.



Staff Sgt. Joyce B. Malone: Malone enlisted in the United States Marine in 1995, she served four years. Before enlisting in the Marines, she was a Fayetteville. After serving in the Marine Corp, she decided to get married and complete college at Fayetteville State University. While working

at Fort Bragg, she decided to join the Army Reserve - Fort Bragg's 82nd Airborne Division in 1971. Malone became the first and the oldest black woman to earn Airborne wings in the United States Army Reserve in 1974. At a young age Malone had completed 15 parachute jumps during her time in the Army Reserve.

SKIN CANCER AWARENESS
